


World's Hottest Hotels: Miami Beach

Rooms: Guest rooms, suites and a penthouse

Restaurant(s): The Faena offers two restaurants, **Los Fuegos** by Francis Mallman and **Pao** by Paul Qui. Los Fuegos features Argentine grillmaster Francis Mallmann who creates a live-fire cooking experience in an open-fire kitchen, and he cooks with local ingredients to create his famous savory dishes. Pao offers modern Asian cuisine with ocean views, featuring a range of international styles that include Filipino, Japanese, Spanish and French.

Pool: Known for their signature candy-striped umbrellas, the Faena pool provides a luxurious, comfortable area for sun-bathing and outdoor activities. With the beach just steps away, the outdoor area makes for the ultimate relaxation getaway.

Extras: The Faena offers the **Tierra Santa Healing House**, a 22,000-square-foot hammam, the largest on the East Coast. It features shaman-developed body-healing rituals and treatments, along with facials and massages.
